This webpage houses the link to the Great Start Dataset, which prompts you to log in using the username MichiganECSN@mlppkidscountb2c.onmicrosoft.com and password veF5oM#@u! where you will have access to custom visualizations, regional ECSN data, table views and more.

The Great Start Dataset Web Page also has other great informational tools, such as instructions on how to download data from the dataset, a video tutorial on how to navigate the dataset, your "preventable hospitalizations" indicator instructions, and a list of the indicators available for the last 5 years at the ECSN regional level.

# **MDE/OGS Updates**

### Early Childhood Standards of Quality-New!

These standards of quality were approved in November. View the document HERE. This set of standards replaces Michigan's current Early Childhood Standards of Quality for Infant and Toddler Programs and Early Childhood Standards of Quality for Prekindergarten.



#### Caring for MI Future

Caring for MI Future is a statewide effort to help childcare entrepreneurs open 1,000 new or expanded childcare programs by the end of 2024.

Our Strong Start (OSS) is part of Caring for MI Future. Our Strong Start is focused on recruiting new childcare entrepreneurs and helping current childcare businesses expand.

You can bookmark the sites above to stay informed about grants and supports currently available or coming soon to help entrepreneurs find and renovate space, recruit staff, obtain start-up funding, and support creating a business plan, in addition to community partner opportunities.

### Facilities Improvement Fund Grant Program

Facilities Improvement Fund is a grant program to distribute \$50 million to new and expanding child care education providers across the state of Michigan in order to renovate and upgrade their child care facilities to accommodate additional child care slots, especially in geographic areas with limited providers. Early childhood education centers are able to receive up to \$150,000 per licensed location. Family and group child care homes are able to receive up to \$50,000 per licensed location.
